

# COVID-19 Preparedness Plan for Traverse County Park

**Traverse County** is committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for all our workers and those that utilize the county park. To ensure we have a safe and healthy environment, we have developed the following COVID-19 Preparedness Plan in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Our goal is to mitigate the potential for transmission of COVID-19 in our county, and that requires full cooperation among our patrons of the park. Only through this cooperative effort can we establish and maintain the safety and health of the community.

Traverse County Sheriff's Office will be patrolling and monitoring the County Park as they do every year.

We are serious about safety and health and keeping our community healthy. Our COVID-19 Preparedness Plan follows Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) guidelines, federal OSHA standards related to COVID-19 and Executive Order 20-48, and addresses:

- hygiene and respiratory etiquette;
- social distancing;
- cleaning, disinfecting, decontamination

If the following rules are not followed Traverse County may opt to close the park. Please follow the rules.

## Handwashing

Basic infection prevention measures should be practiced. Wash your hands for at least 20 seconds with soap and water frequently throughout the day, but especially prior to any mealtimes and after using the toilet. Campers are responsible for providing their own means of washing/sanitizing hands.

## Respiratory etiquette: Cover your cough or sneeze

You should cover your mouth and nose with their sleeve or a tissue when coughing or sneezing and avoid touching your face, in particular your mouth, nose and eyes, with your hands.

## Social distancing

Social distancing of at least six feet between individuals from different households must be followed. Space between camp sites should be adequate to allow for social distancing. Campsites should be at least 50 feet apart from the centerlines of surrounding campsite spurs and the adjacent campsite, or at least 30 feet apart from the near sides of adjoining spurs.

## Cleaning and disinfection

All public spaces such as the shelters, picnic tables, and playground equipment will have yellow caution tape around them and are not to be used. The public bathrooms will be locked. There will not be routine disinfection or cleaning of these facilities, this is why they are not available for use.
